

ROADMAP – Guidance and Template

The Promise 2 project envisages the development of national/regional roadmaps in all project countries.

Drawing up National/regional Roadmaps: National, or where relevant, regional roadmaps towards the establishment of multi-disciplinary and interagency teams according to the Barnahus model and the PROMISE Good Practice Standards will be drafted for all project countries, setting out key milestones towards the establishment of Barnahus in each national context. This process will be supported by the PROMISE Expert team and the associated partners. (Promise 2 Project Description)

Since the roadmaps forms part of the project deliverables that the partners have committed to, they must be **finalised and submitted before the end of the project**.

The purpose of the roadmap is to document **and communicate your vision and strategy** towards establishing, operating and developing the Barnahus model in your country in a simple and accessible format. The roadmap aims to:

- Provide a guiding document for executing and monitoring your strategy
- Facilitate interagency agreement and internal alignment so that everyone works in a coordinated way towards the same goal
- Facilitate exploration and planning of different options, scenarios and activities
- Communicate your vision and strategy to an external audience

The roadmap should preferably be **adopted by all concerned agencies**. If this is not possible, it is desirable that the **management of Barnahus formally adopts and signs the roadmap**.

The **format for the roadmap is flexible**, but we recommend a **simple and accessible format**, such as a Gantt chart. The roadmap does **not need to include small details**; it can be kept fairly high-level. To make the roadmap clear, it is helpful to create groupings of initiatives or goals. The road map should include **all the activities and deliverables that you implement to achieve your vision and overall goal for Barnahus**, for example roundtables, training, exchange, interagency agreement, evaluation etc. In cases where establishment of Barnahus is scheduled it can also include **concrete steps towards establishing Barnahus**, such as acquiring premises, establishing a budget, recruiting team, developing interagency agreements and procedures etc.

Enclosed to this document, you will find an excel document with a Gantt chart **template for inspiration**. Please note that **you will need to complete the Gantt chart with your specific information**.

If you already have a roadmap in place, there is no need to develop a new, specific one for Promise. It is not necessary to translate the roadmap into English, but we ask that you submit a **short overview in English** of the vision, key goals and activities.

To think about:

- Clearly connect the different elements recorded in the roadmap with your vision and goals
- Ensure that you clearly define roles and responsibilities
- Carefully consider the timing of the different elements
- Make sure that you document all the activities that you have and will implement under Promise 2, alongside any additional elements that contribute to the achievement of your vision
- Make sure that the roadmap is visually clear and attractive
- Make sure that you review and update your roadmap so it reflects new developments.
- Which groups of initiatives or goals can your roadmap be structured around?
